How to Apply for Financial Aid At CSHA

Title IV Financial Aid Programs- 2025/2026 Award Year

Our goal is to expedite and simplify the application process for financial aid. Please contact us with your questions and to schedule an appointment.

If you plan to start on or after July 1, 2025, you will apply for financial aid in the 2025/2026 federal award year of July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026. To have financial aid award money applied to first quarter tuition and fees, it is important to apply early.

Financial aid forms can be intimidating; we are happy to assist you and answer your questions! You're welcome to call and schedule a time to meet with Jeff Penton, Financial Aid Administrator, for support or you can complete step 1 below.

- Please complete the 2025/2026 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov. To ensure that CSHA receives your information, use the federal school code 035844 as you enter your 2023 tax information. If you are under the age of 24, parent information and participation will be required to complete the FAFSA.
- 2. When you have completed the FAFSA, please forward the email that you received from the US Department of Education with the subject line "We received your FAFSA form" to financialaid@csha.net

Federal Pell Grant

Award amount from \$530 to \$5,282

The Federal Pell Grant is money awarded to eligible students that does not have to be paid back. Eligibility for the grant is based on 2023 income as well as other factors. Students who have received a Bachelor's degree are ineligible to receive the Pell Grant. Monies are awarded per payment period (1st half and 2nd half of the program) and applied directly to college tuition and fees.

Federal Direct Loans

Subsidized – up to \$2500

This need-based loan program provides funds to eligible students, and is required to be paid back. Interest on this loan is subsidized by the federal government while the student is enrolled in school at least half-time. Principal repayment of the loan begins after the six-month grace period. Eligibility is based primarily on 2023 income. (Financial Aid information continued on next page)

Unsubsidized – up to \$4286

This loan program is not need-based. Interest on this loan is accrued on the day of disbursement, but can be deferred. If the interest is deferred, it may be capitalized (added to the principal amount borrowed). Principal repayment of the loan begins after a six-month grace period following the student's graduation or last day of attendance.

Federal PLUS Loans

Loan amount to \$10,000 or more as student budget allows

The PLUS loan (Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students) is available to eligible parent(s) of dependent students. Both the interest and principal repayment begin upon the student completing the program or their last day of attendance. The lender will perform a credit check on the parent(s). If the parent(s) is/are declined for the PLUS loan, the dependent student may apply for unsubsidized direct loans up to independent student award limits.

Lymphatic Drainage 2 & 3 are now Lymphatic Drainage 2 – 65 clock hours - This course builds upon the basic skills taught in Lymphatic Drainage Level 1 and provides sequences and techniques needed to fully address the entire body intrinsically and extrinsically. Students will continue to expand their technical skills in providing Lymphatic Drainage Massage to the face, neck, torso, arms and legs with particular attention to working with the deeper flow. Lymphedema will be reviewed. Students will learn lymphatic sequences to work with the organs, joints, intra-oral and nasal passages. The anatomy and physiology of these structures and organs will be presented from a lymph perspective.
